THEME: HOW COULD YOU SHOW KINDNESS TO YOUR NEIGHBOR? HELPING WITH YARD WORK? BRINGING A PLATE OF COOKIES? WALKING THEIR DOG? MAKING THEM A GET WELL OR BIRTHDAY CARD? MAKE A PIECE OF ART THAT SHOWS YOU DOING AN ACT OF KINDNESS FOR A NEIGHBOR. THE ARTWORK MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A 25–200 WORD ESSAY THAT EXPLAINS WHY THE ARTWORK REPRESENTS YOUR KINDNESS. FORMAT AND SIZE: EACH ARTIST MAY SUBMIT ONE WORK OF ART. ARTWORK ACCEPTED: OIL, WATERCOLOR, ACRYLICS, PASTELS, AND MIXED MEDIA. ART MUST BE ON PAPER OR CANVAS PAPER (NOT IN FRAMES), MEASURING ONE OF THESE TWO STANDARD SIZES; LANDSCAPE (11 INCHES BY 14 INCHES) OR PORTRAIT (8.5 INCHES BY 11 INCHES). THE ESSAY CAN BE HANDWRITTEN OR TYPED AND SHOULD BE PAPER CLIPPED TO THE ART ENTRY.

ENTRY FEE: FREE! THERE IS NO CHARGE TO SUBMIT WORK FOR THIS CONTEST.

AWARDS: \$100 ART SUPPLY SHOPPING SPREE FOR FIRST PLACE AND ART SUPPLY GIFT BASKETS FOR SECOND AND THIRD PLACES WILL BE AWARDED.

JURIED SELECTION PROCESS: REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE ARTS COMMUNITY, THE CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER AND FAYETTEVILLE ARTS COUNCIL WILL SELECT FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD PLACE WINNERS. (DUE TO LIMITED SPACE, NOT ALL WORKS CAN BE DISPLAYED.)

TIMELINE OF COMPETITION: HAND DELIVER WORKS OF ART WITH ENTRY FORM TO THE ARTS COUNCIL (301 HAY STREET) OR TO THE CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER (222 ROWAN STREET) BETWEEN OCTOBER 17 AND 21.

WINNERS WILL BE ANNOUNCED AT THE ART CONTEST RECEPTION HELD AT THE ARTS COUNCIL, 301 HAY STREET, NOVEMBER 1, 2022 FROM 5:30—7:00 PM (AN EMAIL WILL BE SENT TO THOSE WHO WILL BE RECOGNIZED AT THE EVENT.)

ART MUST BE PICKED UP AT THE ARTS COUNCIL BETWEEN 9 AM AND 4:30 PM BETWEEN NOVEMBER 22ND AND 30TH. ANY ARTWORK NOT PICKED UP BY NOVEMBER 30TH WILL BE CONSIDERED ABANDONED BY THE ARTIST AND DISPOSED OF WITHOUT RECOURSE TO THE ARTIST.

RIGHTS AND CONDITIONS: THE ARTIST GRANTS THE CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER AND ITS PARTNERING AGENCIES PERMISSION TO PHOTOGRAPH/VIDEOTAPE ANY WORKS ACCEPTED FOR THE COMPETITION FOR ARCHIVAL, PUBLICATION AND PUBLICITY PURPOSES. ALL WORKS OF ART, INCLUDING THE FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD PLACE WINNING PIECES, BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CAC, INCLUDING REPRODUCTION RIGHT. PARTICIPATION IN THIS COMPETITION PROCESS CONSTITUTES AN UNDERSTANDING AND ACCEPTANCE OF THE CONDITIONS SET FORTH IN THIS PROSPECTUS.
