This fall we are sponsoring along with the Cumberland County Public Library an Art Contest. The Call for Art can be located on our website www. cacfaync.org. The theme for the Art contest is Brave Autumn: Growing Strong with Love & Light. How are

Love & Light? This is open to Kindergarteners through 12th grade. There is no entry fee. Items can be dropped off to the CAC the week of October 20-24, 2025. Art will be displayed at the downtown public library during the month of November. On November 5, 2025, we will recognize our winners with a reception at the downtown library.

Our goal for the month is to increase commitment and provide educational activities, both for children and adults to gain understanding around child abuse prevention. Harvest Awareness during November serves as a reminder to all of us that there is something each of us can do to make a difference in our community to prevent child abuse.

We will also be providing body safety classes to some of the youngest citizens in our community our Pre-K classes in child care centers. We will have volunteer readers go out and provide a body safety class to help children know how to reach out to trusted adult. According to the Monique Burr Foundation there are benefits of providing consistent prevention education to children, such as lowering dropout rates, improved school attendance and increased test scores and grade point averages. The curriculum comes from the Monique Burr Foundation out of Florida. The curriculum is called "Child Safety Matters." The lesson will include an introduction to MBF's five safety rules:

- Make a Move



WHAT WE DO

A Place of Healing and Hope: Joining hands with community partners, the Child Advocacy Center (CAC) offers a safe and child-friendly place to interview, investigate and provide support for child victims of abuse. The CAC also provides prevention education for parents, professionals, and agencies in our community. We look to a future where all children live in a safe and nurturing environment free from abuse.

During FY 2025, the Child Advocacy Center made a meaningful impact in our community by providing 538 forensic interviews and offering Victim Family Advocate services to 524 families, ensuring they received direct aid and access to critical resources. A total of 103 children participated in individual counseling and 33 children took part in group counseling sessions, while 956 community members attended child abuse prevention and awareness education programs. Volunteers gave an incredible 1,722 hours of service, and our therapy dogs and their handlers brought comfort through 47 visits. Together, these efforts reflect the CAC's ongoing commitment to protecting children, supporting families, and raising awareness. For more information, please visit CACFAYNC.org.
